The third annual Minority Economic Summit, presented by Trend Magazine, will be Aug. 11-12 at the Adam's Mark Hotel in Charlotte.

The theme for this year's event, sponsored by USAir, is "Knowledge, Wisdom and Wealth."

Summit founder Juan Whipple said the focus will be on minority business growth.

"We're creating a forum in which to provide information that's relevant to the economic well-being of the minority community," Whipple said.

The summit will feature two workshops on Aug. 12 that show minority business owners how to find alternate sources of capital.
